Soccer goals can be dangerous if not used properly. Every year, children are killed or injured in accidents involving goals. Most accidents happen during horseplay, such as climbing on the goals or attempting to do chin ups, thereby tipping the goal over. Some accidents happen when strong winds blow the goals over.

To promote safety, Medford Soccer's policy regarding the use of goals is as follows:

- Goals (with the exception of the pug nets) must be moved only under the supervision of coaches.
- Goals must be placed on flat ground, never on an inclined surface.
- Goals must be weighted down with weighted bags at each practice and each game. Weighted bags are to be placed in the back corners of each goal, to provide the most counter-balance.
- Goals may never be left unattended. When a practice or game is over and there are no other teams coming on to play, the coach is responsible for ensuring that the goals are moved back to their storage location and chained and locked against the fence.
- No one may climb on the goal or play in the netting
